





Salmon River Restoration Council's mission is to restore, maintain, and protect the Salmon River ecosystems through stakeholder collaboration, highlighting active community participation and the development of a sustainable economy based on ecological compatibility.

Long Term Goals

- **Enlist** community members in a cooperative approach to protect and restore the Salmon River aquatic and terrestrial ecosystems.
- **Create** economic stability in the community by diversifying job opportunities based on restoration and conservation.
- **Promote** cooperative planning, education and management efforts with the managing agencies, academia, the Native American Tribes, the community and other stakeholders.
- **Help** fill the resource management gaps left by traditional large governmental agencies which have a difficult time conceptualizing and implementing small or non-traditional projects.

The Salmon River Restoration Council (SRRC) is a non-profit organization that has been serving California's Salmon River watershed and its community since 1992. We work cooperatively to assess, protect, maintain, and restore the ecosystems of the spectacular Salmon River.



With the active participation of the local community, our projects focus on anadromous fisheries resources and the development of a sustainable economy. Strong community partnerships are essential to our work.



We believe that educating and empowering the river community to become effective stewards of the ecosystem is a centerpiece in the recovery of our watershed and in particular the declining fisheries resource.

We work to foster the health and well being of our region and its inhabitants through a variety of projects and programs. The programs include our:

- **Fisheries Program** - engages in cooperative fisheries monitoring, research, and habitat restoration for multiple species throughout the Salmon River watershed; improves fish passage to spawning and rearing habitat.
- **Cooperative Noxious Weed Program** - a community-based approach to eradicating noxious weeds in our watershed using manual control methods rather than toxic herbicides.
- **Fire Planning and Fuels Reduction Program** - promotes a collaborative approach to fire planning and fuels reduction projects in the Salmon River landscape.
- **Water Quality Monitoring Program** - monitors water quality and quantity on the Salmon River and its tributaries in order to better promote and understand the health of the river and its fisheries.
- **Riparian Restoration Program** - improves riparian habitat in order to benefit fish; increases shade to reduce water temperatures, and restore native riparian vegetation.
- **Watershed Education Program** - integrates watershed and fisheries awareness into the curricula of the two Salmon River schools.
- **Road Stewardship Program** - works to reduce or eliminate the problems caused by public and private roads in the Salmon River watershed, emphasizing neighborhood stewardship activities.
- **River Clean-Up Program** - helps maintain a clean and litter-free watershed.
